Many of the community children expressed thanks for the great work God has done in their lives through the feeding ministry. Your gifts made it possible to purchase a quarter of beef to give each of the children a few bites of meat in addition to beans and rice. Each child was also given a lollipop and a bar of soap. The CCC leaders shared about the day: "The children were excited to eat meat for the first time and also gifts like candy and soap made them so happy. That day was really a happy day when the children heard that they are going to receive candy."
