In the July 2014 newsletter we shared the story of a devastating fire in India that resulted in the loss of homes for sixty-eight families. Two of the families were pastors that Global Outreach helps to support.

tians in the village and all of the village people were idol worshippers. After sharing the gospel and praying for healing for many of the villagers, some accepted Christ as Savior and we were able to develop a gospel ministry. Fifteen years ago we were able to purchase 125 square meters of land to build a church, but we did not have the funds to build until this year. Earlier this year our country had elections and some of the political candidates gave donations to help us build the church we had been waiting so long to build. The money they gave was not sufficient to complete the church, but by faith we took a small loan and constructed a church with brick and cement walls and iron sheets for the roof. Please help us with the funds to pay off this small loan.

The Pothinnedupalem church was dedicated the 18th of August and is a blessing to this village. In addition to church services, the building is used to help provide protection and a safe haven for many widows and elderly. This is a great need for elderly Christians in India who are often disowned by their families. They currently need an additional 54 cots and repairs to 17 cots. We would love to help them purchase cots to provide more comfort and protection for these precious elderly brothers and sisters in Christ. A gift of \$25 will provide a new cot and \$10 will provide a new blanket.

This young man who goes by the name of Johnny was born into a Muslim family. Shortly after his birth, his father died leaving his mother a widow with a young child

to support. She tried her best to support her young son, but ended up in prostitution. A broker took her to the city of Hyderabad and sold her there, leaving her young son on his own. At that time he was five years old, and he ended up as an orphan boy begging on the streets. One of the Feed My People Pastors went to the village to conduct open air gospel meetings. All day long from morning to night the little boy followed him around. The pastor asked him who he was, and he replied, "I am nobody." When the pastor was unable to find anyone who knew him or any family member he brought him to the orphanage and they named him Johnny. He has lived at the orphanage sixteen years, and now he is studying to be a teacher. Johnny is just one of hundreds of orphaned children in India that your gifts have helped feed, clothe, educate, house and teach about Jesus. Johnny is now "somebody" that Jesus loves!
