New Homes Needed in India

January 2021

In the November 2020 newsletter we shared the news of devastating cyclones and flooding that heavily damaged two of the orphanages that were established nearly thirty years ago with Global Outreach funding. Since then, the local government condemned both buildings and required them to be torn down.

After Regulakunta Orphanage was demolished the children are now living in the local church. It is important to build a new home for these precious children as quickly as possible. The new home will include three rooms. One room will be for Pastor Paul and his wife, one room for the boys and one room for the girls. The new home is estimated to cost \$20,000.





Children from Pothavaram Orphanage are now living with church members.

The new building that is needed for Pothavaram Children's Home will be larger. In addition to the three bedrooms for the children and Sister Ludhiyamma, a hall will also be included. This will be used for church services as well as other community events. The estimated cost for the Pothavaram Children's Home is \$25,000.

Both buildings will also include a large verandah where elderly and homeless church members are able to sleep at night. We invite you to prayerfully-consider helping fund the building of these much needed new homes in India.
