

try providing support for lepers, orphans, pastors, home churches, leadership training and purchasing Bibles.

For many years we have helped support \*Bethel Orphanage

which is run by \*Li Su and her husband. Now that Pastor Daniel is no longer supporting her work, it is more important than ever for us to provide consistent monthly support she can rely on. We are now communicating with her through Andrew and Danh, who we introduced to her a few years ago. We asked Danh (who is Vietnamese) to have Li Su provide us with a

monthly budget for caring for the orphans. We discovered that she is actually managing two orphanages with forty children and teenagers. In addition, she conducts eleven classes for children who are unable to attend school. Three of these classes are held in rented spaces. The remaining eight are held on the street or under bridges. She also feeds the children and provides some items for their basic needs. When Danh asked her to provide her monthly budget, he told us she was surprised by the amount. He said she cried so hard at that time and gave thanks to the Lord for His provision. She doesn't dare think about it because it's too much for her to take care of, but she trusts in God and His mercy. She needs \$2,500 monthly to continue these important outreach ministries. We asked Danh to give her our commitment to provide at least \$500 monthly towards her expenses. When he told her, she was moved to tears by the generosity of our Global Outreach partners. Any donations designated for Vietnam will be a tremendous help to this fruitful outreach ministry to children.

It was our joy and privilege to know and support Pastor Daniel and we are thankful we can help Li Su continue the good work inspired by his vision for his homeland of Vietnam.

## Floods in India

Reverend Thomas, founder of Feed My People (FMP) in India continues to seek help for numerous challenges they are facing. They have suffered much from the Covid virus and we have sent financial aid several times. They have provided food to hundreds of people and continue to feed children and the elderly who are in dire need. We have also provided financial assistance to pay medical bills for pastors who have been hospitalized due to the ongoing pandemic.

In October ravaging rain and flooding have added to the misery. Two of the orphanages built by Global Outreach about twenty eight years ago, have been heavily damaged or destroyed. Pastor Thomas explained that one night around midnight, the roof of Regulagunta orphanage was damaged and the tiles were dropping into the bedrooms where the children were sleeping. He said, "the children cried out to the Lord and Pastor Paul and his wife embraced the children and led them outside. After two hours outside in the wind and rain, they were able to get them safely inside the church." Another FMP church collapsed and Pastor Raju and his family safely escaped.

In addition, it is time to send money to buy the fabric to sew school uniforms for the children. When possible we also send funds to provide treats or a small gift for the children at the 13 orphanages for Christmas. This year Pastor Thomas is asking for funds to purchase blankets for the children. They are cold at night during the rainy season.
