The Rebuilding of Pentapadu Orphanage

In the village of Pentapadu some 150 kilometers from Tenali, a small orphanage provides a home for ten children. Reverend Ezekiel serves as a local pastor for the village and the supervisor of the orphanage. He grew up as an orphan himself in the Tenali Feed My People orphanage. The Pentapadu orphanage is one of eleven orphanages in the Feed My People network which Global Outreach supports monthly.

For seven years, the Pentapadu children were housed in a bamboo hut with a thatched roof. Last December the roof finally gave way after two months of heavy rains. Thankfully, no one was severely injured. Since then the children have been living in a rented building in the same village. The Lord recently made a way for these children to have a permanent home when a wealthy Hindu man was healed of chronic

illness after receiving prayer. He converted to Christianity and made a large offering to begin construction of a concrete building in Pentapadu. Although construction of the walls were completed, work is

currently stopped until additional funds are received to complete this vital project. Please join us in praying and believing that these orphans will soon have a new home.

A New Life for Ammulu

Ammulu was born in the Krishna district of Andhra Pradesh, India. She was kidnapped by a gang while she was still a young child and taken to a brothel house. Unfortunately this is not unusual in Andhra Pradesh, which had more than 1,500 cases of kidnapping or abduction of women reported in 2010. Ammulu was allowed to attend school because educated girls can bring in more money from rich clients. After graduating high school at age 15, she was forced to begin work for the brothel. One night, the man who had booked her became very drunk. Ammulu took the opportunity to run away and soon found herself in a train station. That night a Feed My People pastor was passing out Christian literature at the station. He introduced himself and his ministry, and Ammulu opened up and told him her story. After talking with her, the pastor brought her to the Feed My People medical college in Tenali, housed in the large building that Global Outreach has been constructing for several years. The college is specially designed to provide an alternative to girls rescued from the sex industry. This summer Ammulu graduated from the two year medical training college and is currently working as a nurse. She has accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior and is a living witness to the healing and transforming power of our risen Lord.
