Our friends in Myanmar are facing challenges as the military coup continues. Pastor Cyrus at House of Refuge continues to have difficulty in obtaining funds as the bank remains closed. He has spent many hours in line at the atm machine only to have it run out of money before he can make a withdrawal. The children are set to return to school this week, and Pastor Cyrus is asking for help in purchasing school uniforms and other supplies. We will send funds by Western Union to help them until the banks reopen.

Pastor Richard, leader of Agape Children's Home sends regular updates on the children. Even though the schools in Pone Htun village are closed, they have provided teachers to help the children continue their studies. These children had never attended school prior to living at Agape, so to be able to continue learning brings them great joy. They are also teaching them to be responsible members of the village, and are even models for others as they work together for the good of the village.

Richard shared two urgent needs they have at the children's home. The first is for a water purifier. He explained the water from the well is plentiful, but contaminated with a large amount of lime. The water the village relies on from the mountain is now dried up and the entire village uses the Agape well. The water presents a health risk as they all use it for drinking, cooking and bathing. In a nearby town, the people purchase drinking water, but it is not available in the village. With a water purifier they may even be able to sell some water for added income. The cost for this machine is \$800. Another urgent need is for a refrigerator. They do not have any way to keep leftover food from spoiling. A new refrigerator that will last many years is only \$400. They greatly appreciate any help we can provide.
